Principal's Message

It is my privilege to be the Principal of such a dynamic school that continues to be a wonderful example of educational excellence. Such success is made possible through strong and effective school and community partnerships.

All stakeholders have worked collegially and harmoniously to achieve the best possible outcomes for all engaged learners this year. At Lucas Gardens School, every student is known, valued and cared for, supported by a committed, dedicated and highly skilled staff.

In line with our two strategic directions for 2018-2020, we have five projects, including:

- Literacy and numeracy and the development of a tracking system to inform us of student learning outcomes from Kindergarten to Year 12
- A scope and sequence for science, history and geography to support students from Kindergarten to Year 10
- The establishment of a positive learning team, who this year set up systems, processes and programs to support learning outcomes
- The development of a smooth transition procedure for students entering and exiting our school
- The exploration of various digital communication systems that may be implemented as additional tools between home and school.

These projects were incorporated into our syllabus and have proven to be productive in relation to students' academic achievements.

We are very grateful for the generous donation from a private foundation allowing us to continue to employ a speech therapist, occupational therapist and a physiotherapist. Furthermore, additional funds were donated to the school to purchase a new activity chair

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and to purchase and install outdoor climbing equipment.

The implementation of robotics across the school was also very successful and funds have been allocated in 2019 to build on our current resources.

The school bus has been well utilised this year by students attending excursions to the zoo, aquarium, local parks, dance workshops and the Art Program at Marie Bashir Public School. Our Year 12 graduates attended transition sessions at their post school option settings, to make their transition in 2019 as seamless as possible.

Integration with other schools continues to be a focus area; this year we welcomed Concord Public School, Concord High School and Trinity Grammar School.

In relation to staffing, I am pleased to announce that Rosie Ryan has been successful in obtaining the Assistant Principal position at Yennora Public School. We thank Rosie for her contribution at Lucas Gardens School and wish her every success in this exciting new opportunity.

I would like to touch on the success of Presentation Day and congratulate every student on their achievements. A special thankyou to John Sidoti MP, Mayor Angelo Tsirekas, Lance Brooks, Jacque Weaver, Jacqueline Attard, Justin Coupland, Wendy Stanton and Bartolina Natoli for presenting student awards and attending this annual celebration.
