STEAM Update



This term, as part of our Release from Face to Face (RFF) program, the team and I will be implementing an innovative **STEAM** program. You may have heard the term STEM or **STEAM** – it stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics.

In this newsletter we want to focus on the Education Week theme *Learning Together*. By working together with peers, students are provided opportunities to create and perform musical performances, respond to and create visual artworks and use vocalisations and words to sing along to rhythm and melody.

Our focus this term is on using technology, including robotics, to create music and digital visual arts. Students are able to use technology devices such as Chrome Music Lab on the Commbox (it's a free online program – have a play at home!), Garage Band and other 'cause and effect' music and visual arts apps on the iPad, as well as engineering devices like Makey Makeys to turn bananas into a piano keyboard!


We look forward to sharing what we have been doing in each class.

English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EAL/D)

We aim to develop classroom environments that value the diverse linguistic and cultural experiences of our students. We are currently supporting students for whom English is an additional language or dialect (EAL/D) through the allocation of funds to support explicit instruction in vocabulary development. Learning experiences involve students being supported through shared reading experiences to make connections with their home language and English and to

develop and expand their vocabulary. This program commenced at the beginning of Term 3 and is being supported by our School Learning Support Officers, Zenab and Dennis, and it has been wonderful to see the engagement of students in these sessions.

We are currently purchasing additional bilingual books for our library collection to enable parents/carers to engage in reading at home with their child in their home language.

Primary 7/Secondary 2

Students in Primary 7/Secondary 2 have had a great start to the Term. On Monday, we celebrated Education Week by watching the school video showcasing the learning at Lucas Gardens, as a class.

Students celebrated Education Week on Monday by viewing a school video, which highlighted the students **Learning Together**. Term, students have continued **Learning Together** by working hard on their literacy and communication goals. In English, for literacy stations, students have been working on reading and identifying their sight words and symbols. For phonics, students are producing initial letter sounds with verbal prompting and identifying words and visuals that start with the focus initial letter sound for that week. During shared reading, students are developing their book skills and trying

their best to read their sight words in texts. For handwriting, students have continued to work on their pencil grip while tracing or copying patterns, lines and letters. The students and staff in P5 would like to commend Joji for working extremely hard, as he is now independently writing his name. Well done Joji!

Announcing that Book Week 2020 will be held in Week 2 Term 4!


The theme is:


