

To celebrate Book Week, Primary 3 explored a variety of texts and participated in different activities at school and on Seesaw.


For mathematics this term, students have been learning to share and make equal groups. Everyone has been completing great work, sharing different objects into equal groups based on their colours or shapes.




This is Mariam's shopping list – does she have enough money? Yes, she does!


We have also been practising addition and subtraction. We've used some amazing


